FAQs

Housing Choice Vouchers (Section 8)

When you cannot help everyone in need, who do you help first?

We have established a Preference Points system to allocate housing assistance, illustrated below. Elderly or disabled households receive a high priority. Working households with children are served before households who are not working. Households within Mesa county are served before non-resident households. Households with identical point values will be served in order of their application date & time.

How long will I have to wait for assistance?

It's difficult to say. It depends on several factors including funding, rate of turnover, and size of waitlist. It is a <u>minimum</u> of one year.

What happens if I reach the top of the waiting list?

When an applicant reaches the top of the waiting list, they will be mailed a letter giving them ten business days to respond and begin the eligibility process. If an applicant does not respond they are removed from all GJHA waiting lists. To ensure an applicant receives their letter, it is <u>very important</u> that GJHA always has a correct mailing address. If an applicant needs to update their information with GJHA it must be done in writing. This can be done in person, via mail/fax/email, or by returning this <u>change</u> form.

I need housing immediately, what do I do? Can you recommend other low cost and affordable housing in Mesa County?
